



Conducting A Voter Registration Sunday!

Churches can conduct a Voter Registration Sunday without violating their tax exempt status! Churches can provide voter registration forms to individuals in the church who need to register to vote or who need to update their voter registration. The forms can be obtained from the download section of Advance America's website at www.AdvanceAmerica.com; or the Secretary of State's website at www.in.gov/sos/elections/ or you can register online at www.IndianaVoters.com.

Who Can Vote?

According to the Indiana Secretary of State you have the right to vote in Indiana if:

- You are both a U.S. citizen and a resident of Indiana; and
- You will be at least 18 years of age on or before the next General or Municipal Election, and
- You are not currently in prison after being convicted of a crime; and
- You have lived in the precinct where you vote for at least 30 days prior to the election; and
- You are registered to vote.

Registering To Vote

Individuals should get registered to vote or update their voter registration if:

- They will be 18 by November 4, 2014;
- They have changed their name;
- They have moved recently; or
- They have not voted recently.

*The Voter Registration form must be returned to the County Election Office where the person resides by the close of business on Monday, October 6, 2014 or it must be post marked by Monday, October 6, 2014.

It's best to do this well before the deadline of October 6th!
