Victory In The State Senate!

Senate Bill 65 passed the State Senate on January 30th by a vote of 37-12. SB 65 now goes to the House of Representatives.

Public schools should be focused on teaching children academics, and not teaching them about sex, beginning in kindergarten!

The Solution!

A new state law is needed! In order to protect over 1,000,000 children in the public schools (children in kindergarten, elementary school, middle school and high school) the 2018 Indiana General Assembly needs to pass Senate Bill 65 that clearly states:

“No child in the public schools, beginning in kindergarten, can be taught about sex including sexual activity, sexual orientation, and gender identity without prior written informed parental consent.”

Senate Bill 65 will protect all of the children in the public schools, including children in kindergarten, and also protect the right of parents to direct the upbringing of their children with regard to teaching them about sex.
